**Sir Maurice de Berkeley**, Kt., 2<sup>nd</sup> Baron Berkeley [(**England**) – captured at Bannockburn] (= [1] Eve la Zouche; [2] Isabel de Clare, with whom he had no issue) *T. Wright, The Roll of Arms of the Princes, Barons, and Knights who Attended King Edward I to the Siege of Caerlaverock in 1300 (1864); Douglas Richardson, Royal Ancestry, 5 vols. (2013), 1:331*

**Sir David de Brechin**, Kt., of Brechin, Forfarshire (**Scotland**) (=Margaret de Bonkil, wid. of John Stewart, Kt., of Bonkill) **There remains a question about whether he was present at this siege.** *Douglas Richardson, Royal Ancestry, 5 vols. (2013), 1:238*

**Sir Robert de Brus**, Lord of Annandale [father of King Robert de Brus] (**England** in this battle, as he swore fealty to Edward I of England in 1291, 25 March 1296 [at Wark], and again on 28 April 1296)] (= Marjorie of Carrick)

**Sir Robert Clifford**, 1<sup>st</sup> Baron Clifford of Appleby, Westmoreland and Skipton (in Yorkshire), later 1<sup>st</sup> Lord Warden of the Marches [(**England**) – killed at Bannockburn] (= Maud de Clare) *T. Wright, The Roll of Arms of the Princes, Barons, and Knights who Attended King Edward I to the Siege of Caerlaverock in 1300 (1864)*

**Sir Richard de Cornwall**, Kt., of Asthall, Oxon., &c. [(**England**) – killed at Berwick, in battle] (= Joan [prob. FitzAlan]) *Douglas Richardson, Royal Ancestry, 5 vols. (2013), 2:306-7*

**Sir William Douglas, “the Hardi” (“the Bold”)**, Lord of Douglas, Commander of the Scottish Garrison, and Governor of Berwick-on-Tweed (**Scotland**) (= [1] Elizabeth Stewart; [2] Eleanor of Louvaine) *[www.douglashistory.co.uk/history/williamlehardi.html](http://www.douglashistory.co.uk/history/williamlehardi.html)*

**Sir John FitzMarmaduke**, Kt., Lord of Horden, Eighton, &c. (**England**) (= Ida de Roos) *T. Wright, The Roll of Arms of the Princes, Barons, and Knights who Attended King Edward I to the Siege of Caerlaverock in 1300 (1864)*
