## PARTICIPANTS IN THE SIEGE OF HARBOTTLE CASTLE (1296)

credit: photograph by Ian Cooke, 2016 at travelgumbo.com Historical note: Though no longer king of Scotland, John de Balliol's supporters, led by Sir Robert de Roos, fought and lost to the English. Balliol had abdicated in 1296 (probably very soon before this battle occurred) and was held prisoner at the Tower of London until July 1299. Wikipedia notes, asking for citation, that the English troops were as stated here, but what little appears on the internet concerning this battle is confusing and sometimes conflicts itself; further research is required. However, it is clear the Scottish army of 40,000 troops, led by Robert de Roos, were not successful in the siege. The English, with a much smaller garrison, held the castle, which was later captured and destroyed by Robert Bruce.
