**Sir William Wallace**, Kt. **Sir Robert Clifford**, 1<sup>st</sup> Baron Clifford of Applerby, Westmoreland and Skipton (in Yorkshire), later 1<sup>st</sup> Lord Warden of the Marches [(**England**) – killed at Bannockburn] (= Maud de Clare) *T. Wright, The Roll of Arms of the Princes, Barons, and Knights who Attended King Edward I to the Siege of Caerlaverock in 1300 (1864)*
