**Sir Henry de Beaumont**, Kt., of Folkingham, Earl of Buchan, &c. (**England**) (= Alice Comyn)

**Sir John Comyn III** (c. 1274-1036), Kt., “Red Comyn,” Lord of Badenoch, Guardian of Scotland (1299) [(**Scotland**) taken prisoner (1296-1297); stabbed to death by King Robert de Brus at Dumfries (1306); cousin of Sir John Comyn, 3<sup>rd</sup> Earl of Buchan, above, and son of John Comyn II, “Black Comyn” and Elenaor de Balliol] (= Joan de Valence) *Douglas Richardson, Royal Ancestry, 5 vols. **Sir Simon Fraser** of Neidpath, Kt., Warden of Selkirk, Lord of Oliver Castle (**Scotland** at Dunbar, Edinburgh/Marches, Roslin, Methven) – imprisoned at Dunbar; (**England** at Caerlaverock) – brother-in-law of Richard de Siward, below; executed at London 1306 as a Scottish traitor] (= unk.) *T.
