- Sir William Wallace**, Kt. [(**Scotland** in 1297, 1300, 1303) – captured at the Battle of Robroyston, conveyed to the English king, and executed] www.britannica.com/topic/battle-of-Falkirk;

- Sir Robert Clifford**, 1st Baron Clifford of Applerby, Westmoreland and Skipton (in Yorkshire), later 1st Lord Warden of the Marches [(**England**) – killed at Bannockburn] (= Maud de Clare) *T. Wright, The Roll of Arms of the Princes, Barons, and Knights who Attended King Edward I to the Siege of Caerlaverock in 1300 (1864)*
- Sir Richard FitzAlan**, 8th Earl of Arundel (**England**) (= Alasia di Saluzzo) *Douglas Richardson, Royal Ancestry, 5 vols. (2013), 2:599-602*
- Sir William de Montfichet**, Lord Burnbank, Constable of Dundee [(**England** at Dundee; **Scotland** at Bannockburn, though he was *not* a commander at this last place) – grandfather of Sir William de Montfichet who fought after the Battle of Bannockburn] (= unk.) *Evan Macleod Barron, The Scottish War of Independence (1914), p. 388; F. M. Osborn, The Story of the Mughets (1952), pp. 107-8 plus Table I; E. M. Barron, The Scottish War of Independence (1914), p. 388*
- Sir Henry de Percy**, Kt., of Topcliffe (1273-1314), 1st Baron of Alnwick (**England**) (= Eleanor Fitz Alan) *Douglas Richardson, Royal Ancestry, 5 vols. (2013), 4:348-49*
- Sir James Stewart (or Fitz Alexander)**, Kt., 5th Steward of Scotland [(**Scotland**) – loyal to King Edward I until the 1297 Siege at Dundee, when he became loyal to Scotland, but again submitted to King Edward in 1305; father of Walter Stewart, 6th Steward of Scotland] (= [1] _____ - **no issue**; [2] Muriel of Strathearn – **no issue**; [3] Giles/Egidia de Burgh, mother of Walter, 6th Steward; and he was perh. marr. subsequently) *Douglas Richardson, Royal Ancestry, 5 vols. (2013), 2:15-16; https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/James_Stewart,_5th_High_Steward_of_Scotland*
- Sir John de Warenne**, Kt., 7th Earl of Surrey [(**England**) and his English Army – father-in-law of John de Balliol, King of Scotland] (= Alice de Lusignan) www.britannica.com/topic/battle-of-Falkirk; *T. Wright, The Roll of Arms of the Princes, Barons, and Knights who Attended King Edward I to the Siege of Caerlaverock in 1300 (1864); Douglas Richardson, Royal Ancestry, 5 vols. (2013), 5:310-12*
- Robert Wishart** of Pittarow, Bishop of Glasgow [(**Scotland**) – did not fight, but was a participant of record; captured by the English near Methven] (never marr.; no issue) *W. M. Mackenzie, The Battle of Bannockburn (1913), pp. 89-90; https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Robert_Wishart (with references)*
