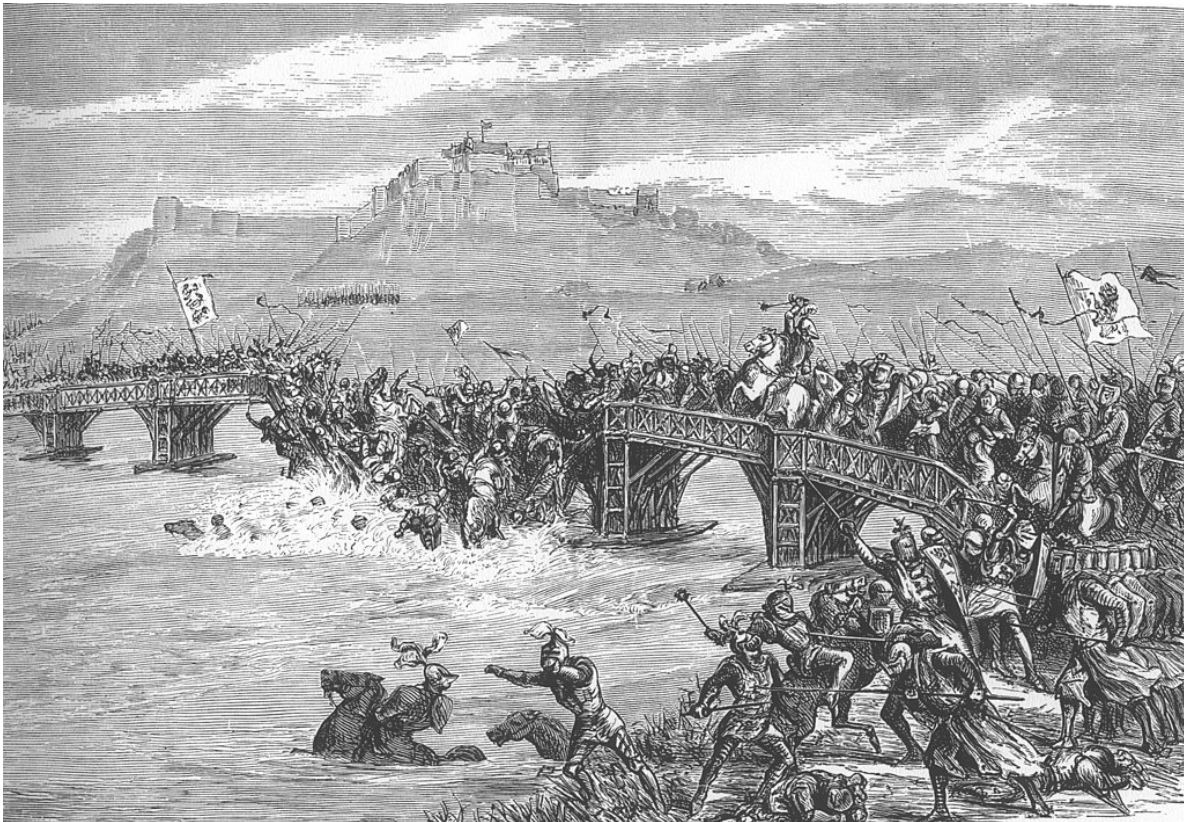

- Sir William Wallace**, Kt. [(**Scotland**) – captured at the Battle of Robroyston, conveyed to the English king, and executed] [www.britannica.com/topic/battle-of-Falkirk](http://www.britannica.com/topic/battle-of-Falkirk); [https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/William\\_Wallace](https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/William_Wallace)
- Sir Hugh de Cressingham**, Lord High Treasurer, Steward of Queen Eleanor (wife of King Edward I) [(**England**) – killed at Stirling Bridge; **father of Alice de Cressingham who m. Robert de Aspale and had iss.**] (= unk.) [https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Hugh\\_de\\_Cressingham](https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Hugh_de_Cressingham); *Dictionary of National Biography (1885-1900)*, 13:71
- Sir William Douglas, “the Hardi” (“the Bold”)**, Lord of Douglas, Commander of the Scottish Garrison, and Governor of Berwick-on-Tweed [(**Scotland**) – captured at Berwick and imprisoned; released after swearing fealty to King Edward, which Douglas again broke in 1297] (= [1] Elizabeth Stewart; [2] Eleanor of Louvaine, wid. of William de Ferrers of Groby {1240-1287} – see **Battle of Falkirk**) [www.douglashistory.co.uk/history/williamlehardi.html](http://www.douglashistory.co.uk/history/williamlehardi.html)
- William FitzWarin**, [(**England**) – He was poss. a first-cousin of Fulk FitzWarin, Kt., of Alveston, who was at with the King in 1300 {prob. at Galloway} and again in 1303 {prob. the English Marches}, but we cannot place him] (= \_\_\_) *Douglas Richardson, Royal Ancestry, 5 vols. (2013), 5:157, 2:662*
- Sir Richard Lundie**, Kt. [(**England**) – a Scottish knight who joined the English after the Capitulation of Irvine on 7 June 1297] [https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Battle\\_of\\_Stirling\\_Bridge](https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Battle_of_Stirling_Bridge)
- Sir Andrew Morey (Moray, Murray), the younger**, of Petty [(**Scotland**) – died from injuries sustained in this battle; son of Andrew Morey, the elder] (**evid. unmarr. and no iss.**) [https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Andrew\\_Moray](https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Andrew_Moray) (with references)
- Sir Henry de Percy**, Kt., of Topcliffe (1273-1314), 1<sup>st</sup> Baron of Alnwick (**England**) (= Eleanor Fitz Alan) *Douglas Richardson, Royal Ancestry, 5 vols. (2013), 4:348-49; Dictionary of National Biography (1885-1900), 13:71* [sub Cressingham, noting “Lord Henry Percy brought {8300 troops} from Carlisle”]
- Sir William de Roos**, Kt., of Ingmanthorpe [(**England**) – son of William de Roos & Eustache Fitz Ralph; brother of Robert de Roos, Baron of Warke, who fought at Harbottle) – **evidently no issue** *Douglas Richardson, Royal Ancestry, 5 vols. (2013), 4:386, which does not give his service, but see 5:157*
- Sir James Stewart (or Fitz Alexander)**, Kt., 5<sup>th</sup> Steward of Scotland [(**Scotland**) – loyal to King Edward I until the 1297 Siege at Dundee, when he became loyal to Scotland, but again submitted to King Edward in 1305; father of Walter Stewart, 6<sup>th</sup> Steward of Scotland] (= [1] \_\_\_\_\_ - **no issue**; [2] Muriel of Strathearn – **no issue**; [3] Giles/Egidia de Burgh, mother of Walter, 6<sup>th</sup> Steward; and he was perh. marr. subsequently) *Douglas Richardson, Royal Ancestry, 5 vols. - Sir Marmaduke de Thweng**, Kt., 1<sup>st</sup> Baron of Kilton (**England**) (= Isabel de Roos, sister of William, above – in this battle’s list) *Douglas Richardson, Royal Ancestry, 5 vols. (2013), 5:157; W. M. Mackenzie, The Battle of Bannockburn (1913), pp. 89-90; W. E. Thwing, Thwing: A Genealogical, Biographical and Historical Account of the Family (1883), pp. 9-10*
- Sir John de Warenne**, Kt., 7<sup>th</sup> Earl of Surrey [(**England**) and his English Army – father-in-law of John de Balliol, King of Scotland] (= Alice de Lusignan) [www.britannica.com/topic/battle-of-Falkirk](http://www.britannica.com/topic/battle-of-Falkirk); *T.
